

**RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS
MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
APRIL, 1ST, 2010**

The Medina Township Board of Trustees met in regular session at the Medina Township Hall on April 1st, 2010, to conduct the business of the Township. President Todd called the meeting to order at 7:05 pm with the following Trustees in attendance: Michel D. Todd, Sarah (Sally) Gardner and Ray Jarrett. Also in attendance were the Fiscal Officer, Police Chief, Asst. Fire Chief, Road Foreman, Asst. Road Foreman, Zoning Inspector and the general public.

Roll Call

Mr. Todd asked for a roll call of all members present. Trustees present were Mr. Todd, Mrs. Gardner and Mr. Jarrett.

Pledge of Allegiance

Mr. Todd led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Moment of Silence

Mr. Todd asked for a moment of silence for our military personnel at home and overseas.

SITE PLANS

Dental Surgical Center – Site & Signs – 3443 Medina Road, Suite 105

Mr. Todd motioned to accept the recommendation of the Zoning Commission and approve the change of use for Dental Surgical Center of Medina to be located at 3443 Medina Road, Suite 105, as presented. Mrs. Gardner seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mrs. Gardner and Mr. Jarrett.

Mr. Todd motioned to accept the recommendation of the Zoning Commission and approve a wall sign for Dental Surgical Center of Medina to be located at 3443 Medina, Road Suite 105, not to exceed 4.7 square feet as presented. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mrs. Gardner.

Mr. Todd motioned to accept the recommendation of the Zoning Commission and approve a tenant panel for Dental Surgical Center of Medina located at 3443 Medina Road, Suite 105, to be placed on the existing identification sign not to exceed 4.66 square feet as presented. Approval of Payroll

Mr. Todd motioned to approve payroll check #13898 to #13919 in the amount of \$26,315.21 with total deductions of \$3,764.60. Mrs. Gardner seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mrs. Gardner and Mrs. Gardner.

Approval of Minutes

Mr. Todd motioned to approve the minutes for the March 18, 2010, regular Meeting. Mrs. Gardner seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mrs. Gardner and Mr. Jarrett.

Purchase Orders/Training Requests

Mrs. Gardner motioned to appropriate \$234.48 to send Shawn Kasson to the National Fire Academy – Executive Development Course in Emmitsburg, Maryland from 4/26 to 5/7, 2010, for transportation and meals. Mr. Todd seconded the motion voting aye thereon: Mrs. Gardner, Mr. Todd and Mr. Jarrett.

Mrs. Gardner motioned to appropriate \$1,296.00 for Simmons Brothers for repair to Fire Station #2 for an insurance issue. Mr. Todd seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mrs. Gardner, Mr. Todd and Mr. Jarrett.

Mrs. Gardner motioned to appropriate \$3,500.00 for Medina Heating & Cooling for the installation of a Trane 2 stage variable furnace to replace the 22 year old furnace at Fire Station #2. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mrs. Gardner, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. Todd.

Mrs. Gardner motioned to appropriate \$2,500.00 for an open purchase order for D&G Uniforms for replacement of uniforms. Mr. Todd seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mrs. Gardner, Mr. Todd and Mr. Jarrett.

Mrs. Gardner motioned to appropriate \$5,000.00 for a blanket purchase order to W. W. Williams for emergency repairs of trucks. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mrs. Gardner, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. Todd.

Mrs. Gardner motioned to appropriate \$4,082.14 to Fallsway Equipment for the repair to fire truck engine 201-2 for an insurance issue. Mr. Todd seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mrs. Gardner, Mr. Todd and Mr. Jarrett. Mrs. Gardner stated that all the insurance money was received minus the deductible for the accident.

Mrs. Gardner said there was an appropriation to send 6 people to Indianapolis and it was brought down to 4. The firefighters decided that all of the attendees will forgo reimbursement for meals in order for the Township to pay for the rooms and registration for 2 more people to go. The appropriation will be for \$786.00 instead of \$850.00.

REPORTS

Service Department

Ed Kerr, Road Foreman, stated that for the month March 2010, the department maintained buildings, equipment and vehicles; installed repaired and replaced signs as needed; plowed and salted roads; moved snow piles; cold patched roads; picked up dead deer on Cook Road; cleaned off catch basins; fixed light at Police Station; fixed light and replaced leaking water valve at Fire Station #2; cleaned plow trucks; built new infield drag; sewer jetted ditch pipe & installed 2 cleanouts on Substation Road; responded to 2 daytime fire calls.

Zoning Department

Elaine Ridgley, Zoning Inspector, reported that for the month of March 2010, 21 permits were issued as follows:

For a total value of permits issued of \$1,008,300.00. Fees collected \$4,646.73 (see attached).

Police Department

Chief Arbogast reported that for the month of March 2010, the department responded to 1,041 calls for service (see attached). Year to date is 2,756. Chief said the COPS grant that was applied for in 2009 will be reassessed this year. Mr. Todd said Linda De Hoff has volunteered to help the departments apply for grants. Chief Arbogast said he is in the process of reviewing a grant for the township signs.

Fire Department

There was no Fire Department report.

Voyager Cards – Fire Department

Mrs. Gardner said the Fire Department will have Voyager Charge Cards in all their vehicles and asked Mrs. George if she needed the receipts kept. Mrs. George said the report must have the detail of who is making the purchases, what type of fuel in what vehicle, etc. Mrs. Gardner and Asst. Chief Kasson said the report would detail the vehicle identification number, mileage, individual making the purchase, date, time and the location of purchase. Mrs. George said as long as the invoice report shows all that information it would be sufficient.

OLD BUSINESS

Parking Violation Policy

Mr. Jarrett feels the parking violations policy is necessary. Chief Arbogast said, if there was a resolution adopted, a determination of every street would have to be made, what the parameters of the street are from one address to another, north side, south side and so on. It would be a resolution with no mechanics to fine or enforce. You would also need a parking violation bureau because Medina Municipal Court will not collect fines for parking regulations. There would be substantial cost incurred to have parking tickets printed, no parking signs etc. A Hearing Officer would also be needed if the ticket was contested. Mrs. Gardner said due to the fiscal environment of the Township it should not be done. Mr. Todd said with the level of bureaucracy it will be very complex. It would cost \$500 to collect a \$100 fine. A resident of N. Huntington Street wanted verification that his relatives will be allowed to park on N. Huntington when they come to visit. Chief Arbogast asked that he call when his relatives will need to park on the street while visiting and he will issue memo to all officers let. Mr. Todd said the street is a collector street and as long as traffic is not impeded they can park on the street.

Parking Violation Policy Con't

Mr. Miller, Asst. Road Foreman, asked if the snow plow drivers can still call Police to have vehicles moved when they are plowing. Mr. Todd and Chief Arbogast said the snow ban is a different issue and yes they are to call the Police. Mr. Jarrett asked if the other Trustees were in favor of the Parking Violation Policy. Mr. Todd and Mrs. Gardner said they were not in favor of it.

Nettleton Road Culvert

Mr. Todd said Bobbie Tilton sent him the changes she wants in the contract. It was sent to the Prosecutor and when it is finished it will be sent back to her and hopefully we can move on.

Township Limit Signs

This item was tabled.

Electric Aggregation

Mrs. Gardner passed out a sample of the wording of the ballot language for the Electric Aggregation Issue. She also said the County Commissioners asked the township to send letters to the newspapers saying they support this issue. The four main points are:

1. It will save residential customers 6% on the "Price to Compare" generation portion of their electric bill for the next nine years.
2. If it passes, they can opt out without charge this year and will be given the chance to opt out every three years. If, during that three year period, you want to opt out the charge will be \$25.00.
3. It will save small business customers 4% on their "Price to Compare" portion of their electric bill for the next nine years.
4. The township government will get a one time grant this year to use for any public purpose.

The 6% on the residential may be down to 4% for all electric homes if they re-instate the special all- electric home discount. The minimum is 4% for everybody and 6% for other residents. Mr. Jarrett said the grant may be up to \$66,000.00 depending on how many residential customers are in the township. A letter will be sent to the newspaper editors.

2010 Census

Mrs. Gardner said the entire Fenway Pointe Subdivision did not receive their census forms. She contacted Akron and gave them the information needed for their data base. The residents that informed Mrs. Gardner of this issue were able to go to the County Administration Building where a census table was set up and get forms.

Community Pick-it-up-Day

Laurie Shoemaker said Pick-it-up-Day will be May 1st, 2010. Orientation will start at 8:30 am at the Service Department Building at 3718 Weymouth Road. As they did the past two years, Dino Makris, owner of Streetside Café, will once again provide the lunch which will be at 12 noon, Home Depot will be providing the water and gloves and Bill Strazinsky, Solid Waste District Central Processing Facility, will be providing the trash bags and waiving the dumping fees. We thank them for their support in this event.

Noise Ordinance/Limited Home Rule

Mr. Todd and Mr. Jarrett said the noise ordinance issue was discussed at the last meeting and it was decided that even if an ordinance is passed it is unenforceable. The Trustees do not want to pass any policy that is unenforceable.

NEW BUSINESS

Set Date for Digital Sign Public Hearing

Mr. Todd set the Digital Sign Public Hearing for April 29, 2010, at 6:30 pm with the Regular Meeting to be held at 7:00 pm.

Zoning Hours/Phone

Mrs. Gardner said the Zoning Inspector has agreed to fill the hours for the Assistant Zoning Inspector while she is on medical leave.

Mrs. Gardner motioned to change Elaine Ridgley's allowable hours per week from 25 to 32 for the 4 to 6 weeks that the Assistant Zoning Inspector, Mary Ann Heiss, is off for medical reasons. Mr. Todd seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mrs. Gardner, Mr. Todd and Mr. Jarrett.

Mrs. Gardner received a letter from Zoning Inspector, Elaine Ridgley, stating she wants to turn in the township cell phone. The letter also states that she understand she will not be reimbursed for Medina Township calls on her personal cell phone. The letter also states that she does not want her personal cell phone given out as a contact number for the Township Zoning Inspector.

Request for Auction or Disposal of Obsolete Township Equipment

Mrs. Gardner discussed the information she has regarding a website GovDeals where items can be put up for sale. She has discussed this with Asst. Chief Kasson and he will look into this for the township's possible use. She asked all departments to make a list of items that are no longer of use to the township.

Entrance to Townhall

Mrs. Gardner said that people using map quest are being directed to the back door of the townhall. Because those steps are slippery when wet and icy in the winter we are trying to dissuade people from coming in that way. Mr. Todd suggested sending a letter to the GPS Organization and they will correct it.

OTHER BUSINESS

Digital Sign Language

Mr. Todd said the language for the digital sign public hearing would be left on the dais if anyone wants to review the wording.

Commendation to Road Department & Police Department

Trustees received an e-mail from Mr. Jeff Johnson commending the Service Department for the excellent job they did maintaining the roads this harsh winter. Mr. Johnson also commended the Police Department, stating they are very approachable, professional and they are constantly visible to those they serve.

Comment on Creative Living Development

Mr. Todd read an e-mail from Sandy Morlan of Joshua's Way in Medina City stating she can't understand why the Creative Living Development is allowed to go in when there will be noise from the businesses in that area.

Ohio Farm Bureau Meeting Notices

Mr. Todd said he usually attends the Ohio Farm Bureau "Leaders Breakfast Meetings". The Farm Bureau will be sending the meeting notices by e-mail and he will include Mr. Jarrett and Mrs. Gardner. Trustees can then decide who will attend the meeting.

OTHER BUSINESS CON'T

Economic Development/County Commissioners

Mr. Todd received a letter from the County Commissioners regarding Economic Development and Corporation. May is Medina County Business Appreciation month. There will be Visitation Teams established to go around to area businesses. Mrs. Gardner said she is already a floating person on the Visitation Team. Mr. Todd and Mr. Jarrett said although they would like to be on the team, it will be difficult for them to go during the day.

Ballfield Fees

Mr. Todd read the letter from Mayor Hanwell regarding the fees for use of the ballfields. The understanding was that when the fields were built the SAP fee would be dropped for Medina Township residents, not because there is a fee/no fee for use of the fields, but because Medina Township would be contributing to the overall playing of the sports associations that are involved with Medina City School District. Last year the Medina Youth Baseball Association made promises of things they were going to do regarding providing materials and maintenance of the fields. They did not fulfill those promises. The letter implies that if we don't drop the fees for MYBA then the SAP fees would be re-established for Medina Township residents. If that happens, then the Trustees will decide on how to handle the issue. Mr. Jarrett and Mrs. Gardner agree that the \$35.00 (per 3 hours) is reasonable for use of the fields. A \$25.00 fee was charged last year and MYBA was the only group not charged. The Trustees feel it is only fair that all associations pay the fee. These fees help to offset the cost of maintaining the fields.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Mr. Todd motioned to open the floor for public comment. Mrs. Gardner seconded the motion.

Erica Graffein, Auditor's Office, the sign-up for tax reductions for senior citizens and disabled citizens June 1, 2010. Also, residents can go on the Auditor's website, medinacountyauditor.org to get more information.

Stan Koplán (3888 N. Huntington) thanked the service department for the good job they did this winter. He said the trash haulers are now coming at 4:00 am and they are noisy. Mrs. Gardner said the Trustees have already contacted the trash haulers regarding the noise issue in Forestview. Mr. Koplán also said the Service Department dug a ditch at the retention basin and the piles of dirt are still there. Mr. Kerr, Foreman, said the dirt will be removed when it is drier. Mr. Koplán asked if screens could be put at the end of the pipes so children can't go in the pipes. Mr. Kerr said no because if a child does go in there they would be trapped in the pipe. Mr. Koplán asked if the Trustees can contact the owner of 5183 Silver Maple and ask that the grass be cut. Mrs. Ridgley said the bank has been contacted. Mr. Todd explained the lengthy seven step process the Township would have to go through to have the owner maintain the property.

Alliss Strogín (3003 Hood Road) said she feels the fees for the sports field is reasonable. The Township charges \$35 per game and the City charges an SAP fee of \$35 per child.

Leslie Merrill (4573 Nettleton Road) asked if the Nettleton Road culvert was going to be done this year. Mr. Todd said Mrs. Tilton had some changes that must be dealt with and hopefully it will be started this year. He also asked if they can fix the bump on Nettleton Road. The Service Department will look into getting that fixed.

Mr. Todd motioned to close the floor for public comment. Mrs. Gardner seconded the motion.

OTHER BUSINESS

Soccer Fields

Mr. Todd spoke with Jeff Kessler, Sports Field Manager, and the Medina Soccer Association regarding fees for use of the soccer fields. They offered to pay a flat fee of \$2,500.00 for use of the fields and pay half of the cost for fixing the fields which would be \$7,000.00. Mr. Kessler said there is one other organization that wants to use the fields; the group consists of children from all over Ohio. The Medina Soccer Association said if the Trustees decide not to grant them exclusive use of the fields then they would only pay \$2,000.00. Mr. Jarrett said it was a very generous offer and at least they are willing to work with us. Mrs. Gardner agreed. Mr. Todd said he will continue to talk with them. Trustees have decided to let other organizations use the soccer fields. They will accept the fee of \$2,000.00. Organizations that service Medina City School District can use the fields for the same terms as Medina Soccer Association. If they are outside of our school district they need to pay x-fee.

Executive Session


Mr. Todd motioned to enter into Executive Session to discuss potential legal matters and legal negotiations with the Medina Township Board of Trustees, the Fiscal Officer, David Sheldon and the representative from C&M Towing. The Board entered into Executive Session at 8:44 pm. The Board reconvened at 8:57 pm where The Board of Trustees, the Fiscal Officer, Attorney, David Sheldon and the representative from C&M Towing were all present to discuss potential litigation and litigation matters. No decisions were made during that meeting.

Mr. Todd motioned to adjourn the meeting at 8:57 pm. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mrs. Gardner.
