#### RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING MAY 24<sup>th</sup>, 2012

The Medina Township Board of Trustees met in regular session at the Medina Township Hall on May 24<sup>th</sup>, 2012, to conduct the business of the Township. Chairman Todd called the meeting to order at 7:09 pm with the following Trustees in attendance: Michael D. Todd, Ray Jarrett and Ken DeMichael. Also in attendance were the Fiscal Officer, Police Chief, Asst. Fire Chief, Road Foreman, Zoning Inspector and the general public.

#### Roll Call

Mr. Todd asked for a roll call of all members present. Trustees present were Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

#### Pledge

Mr. Todd led the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### Moment of Silence

Mr. Todd asked for a moment of silence for our military personnel serving at home and overseas.

#### SITE PLANS

#### Soccer Post - Site - 3705 Pearl Road

Dave Sterrett, representing Soccer Post, read a letter explaining what Soccer Post was (see attached).

Mr. Todd motioned to accept the recommendation of the Zoning Commission and approve the change of use for Soccer Post to be located at 3705 Pearl Road as presented. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

#### Soccer Post - Wall Sign - 3705 Pearl Road

Mr. Todd motioned to accept the recommendation of the Zoning Commission and approve the wall sign for Soccer Post not to exceed 25 square feet as presented. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

#### Soccer Post - Tenant Panel Sign - 3705 Pearl Road

Mr. Todd motioned to accept the recommendation of the Zoning Commission and approve a tenant panel to be placed on the existing pylon sign for Soccer Post not to exceed 14 square feet as presented. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. Jarrett.

## <u>United Methodist Church - Ground Sign - 4747 Foote Road</u>

Mr. Todd motioned to accept the recommendation of the Zoning Commission and approve the ground sign for United Methodist Church not to exceed 27 square feet as presented, landscaping to be incorporated around the base of the ground sign. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

#### OTHER BUSINESS

#### Lori Wallace-Roberts - Ohio Penal Industries - Asbestos Abatement for Remsen Property

Lori Wallace-Roberts from Ohio Penal Industries explained to the Trustees what services the Ohio Penal Industries provides. She is in charge of the construction and asbestos abatement program. The inmates are certified by the Ohio Department of Health. They are the top level inmates who reach a level 1-A status before they can join the crew. Ms. Wallace-Roberts inspected the Remsen property with Linda De Hoff and Chief Arbogast and discussed what needed to be done regarding the asbestos abatement. Mr. Todd asked if this would need to be bid out and was told no because this is a State Program.

#### OTHER BUSINESS CON'T

#### Lori Wallace-Roberts - Ohio Penal Industries - Asbestos Abatement Con't

Mr. Todd said the top priorities are safety and usability of the building. He also asked that the backgrounds of the prisoners be provided to the Trustees. Matt Galla asked about the plumbing. Mr. DeMichael asked what the cost of removing the tile would be and when they could start. Ms. Wallace-Roberts gave an approximate cost of \$20,000.00 to \$30,000.00 and they would be able to start in 6 to 8 weeks. Mr. Jarrett said they can remove the tile or encapsulate it which is painting the tile with some type of epoxy and then carpeting over it. Chief Arbogast said the County is doing an excellent job of cleaning up the building. Bill Ostmann asked Ms. Wallace-Roberts for the website for the OPI.

#### **Approval Accounts Payables**

Mr. Todd motioned to approve warrant #23021 to #23065 total amount of \$104,055.96. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael. Mr. Todd said the main expenditure is for the building.

#### Approval of Payroll

Mr. Todd motioned to approve payroll checks #16009 to #16031 total amount of \$26,400.20 with \$4,815.68 going to union dues, post tax health, OPERS and Deferred Comp. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

#### Approval of Supplemental Appropriation Changes

Mr. Todd motioned to approve the appropriation changes for account #1000-760-720-0 from \$0 to \$80,623.50 for the purchase of the Remsen Road property. For account #1000-120-322-0 from \$5,400.00 to \$9,400.00 for "Dumpster Day" dumpster activities. Account #1000-120-351-0 from \$4,000.00 to \$10,500.00 for \$6,500.00 for electricity appropriation for the Remsen Road Property. Account #1000-120-352-0 for \$900.00 to \$3,700.00 for water/sewage appropriation for Remsen Road Property and account #1000-120-353-0 for \$2,379.91 to \$16,379.91 for natural gas appropriation for the Remsen Road property. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett,

She relayed that message to the complainant and asked if the cars were indeed her neighbors and the complainant said yes because her husband notarizes the titles for the man.

Mrs. Shoemaker reported on the status of the Flag Day Ceremony and said everything is moving forward. The Trustees will decide on the essay winners and send their choices to Mrs. Shoemaker. Mr. Todd and Mr. DeMichael will attend an awards ceremony on June 4 to hand out the certificates.
