

**RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS
MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
DECEMBER 6TH, 2012**

The Medina Township Board of Trustees met in regular session at the Medina Township Hall on December 6th, 2012, to conduct the business of the Township. Chairman Todd called the meeting to order at 7:02 pm with the following Trustees in attendance: Michael D. Todd, Ray Jarrett and Ken DeMichael. Also in attendance were the Fiscal Officer, Asst. Fire Chief, Police Chief, Road Foreman, Zoning Inspector, Todd Hunt, Township Legal Counsel, Bill Thorne and David Folk, Asst. County Prosecutors and the general public.

Roll Call

Mr. Todd asked for a roll call of all members present. Trustees present were Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Pledge

Mr. Todd led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Moment of Silence

Mr. Todd asked for a moment of silence for our military personnel serving at home and overseas. He also asked for people to root for Army in the Army/Navy game.

OTHER BUSINESS

Executive Session – Todd Hunt, Township Legal Counsel

Mr. Todd motioned to go into Executive Session with the Medina Township Board of Trustees and Township Legal Counsel, Todd Hunt, to discuss pending litigation. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael. Mr. Todd amended his motion to include Elaine Ridgley. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael. The Board entered into Executive Session at 7:08 pm. Mr. Todd motioned to reconvene from Executive Session at 7:51 pm where the Board of Trustees was present with Zoning Inspector, Elaine Ridgley and Township Legal Counsel, Todd Hunt discussing pending litigation. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett. No decisions were made during that meeting.

Executive Session – Asst. County Prosecutors Bill Thorne and David Folk

Mr. Todd motioned to go into Executive Session with the Board of Trustees, Township Fiscal Officer, Linda DeHoff, Township Road Foreman, Denny Miller, Township Legal Counsel, David Folk and Bill Thorne to discuss imminent litigation with the Township Board of Trustees. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael. The Board entered into Executive Session at 7:52 pm. Mr. Todd motioned to reconvene from Executive Session at 8:27 pm, where the Board of Trustees was present with Fiscal Officer, Linda DeHoff, Road Foreman, Denny Miller and Township Legal Counsel, Bill Thorne and Dave Folk, to discuss pending litigation with the Township. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael. No decisions were made during that meeting.

Karvo Paving – Paving Issues

Mr. Todd said there were issues with the contract for the roads and compliance of the road asphalt mix which Road Foreman, Denny Miller, had observed. Mr. Todd motioned for the Township to assert that based on the Revised Code that we only pay 60% of the 402 materials to Karvo Construction for the road project. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Medina Soccer – Site – 3074 Remsen Road

Mr. Todd motioned to accept the recommendation of the Zoning Commission and approve the change of use (additional space) for Medina Soccer Association located at 3074 Remsen Road as presented. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

CLO2 Systems – Site – 3247 Pearl Road

Mr. Todd motioned to accept the recommendation of the Zoning Commission and approve the change of use for CLO2 Systems to be located at 3247 Pearl Road as presented. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Westfield Bank – Site – 4015 Medina Road

Mr. Todd motioned to accept the recommendation of the Zoning Commission and approve the change of use for Westfield Bank to be located at 4015 Pearl Road as presented. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

Westfield Bank – Center Portico Sign – 4015 Medina Road

Mr. Todd motioned to accept the recommendation of the Zoning Commission and approve a portico sign over the center of the building for Westfield Bank not to exceed 13 square feet as presented. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Westfield Bank – East Side Portico Sign – 4015 Medina Road

Mr. Todd motioned to accept the recommendation of the Zoning Commission and approve a portico sign on the east side of the building for Westfield Bank not to exceed 11 square feet as presented. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

Westfield Bank – Pylon Sign – 4015 Medina Road

Mr. Todd motioned to accept the recommendation of the Zoning Commission and approve the wording, Westfield Bank, on the existing pylon identification sign for the office park not to exceed 5.9 square feet as presented and a tenant panel for Westfield Bank to be placed on the existing pylon identification sign not to exceed 1.33 square feet as presented. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Kat Lotus Nail Bar– Site – 2763 Medina Road Unit #28 (Plaza 71)

Mr. Todd motioned to accept the recommendation of the Zoning Commission and approve the change of use for Kat Lotus Nail Bar and Beauty Lounge to be located at 2763 Medina Road, Unit #28 in Plaza 71 as presented. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

Malley's Chocolates– Site – 4191 Pearl Road

Mr. Todd motioned to accept the recommendation of the Zoning Commission and approve the change of use for Malley's Chocolates to be located at 4191 Pearl Road as presented. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

Malley's Chocolates – 2 Ground Signs – 4191 Pearl Road

Mr. Todd motioned to accept the recommendation of the Zoning Commission and approve two ground signs not to exceed 29.47 square feet each for Malley's Chocolates to be located at 4191 Pearl Road as presented. It was so noted this is a corner lot and that landscaping is to be incorporated around the base of each sign. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael. (The landscaping plan was provided and attached to the ground signs paperwork).

Malley's Chocolates – Wall Sign – 4191 Pearl Road

Mr. Todd motioned to accept the recommendation of the Zoning Commission and approve a wall sign facing Pearl Road on the northwest elevation of the building for Malley's Chocolates not to exceed 38.47 square feet as presented. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

Weymouth Preservation Society Update

Susan McKiernan, President of the Weymouth Preservation Society, asked Mrs. Gardner to read a letter updating the Trustees on the progress being made at the museum (see attached).

Mark Herwick – Homestead Insurance

Mr. Herwick explained the changes between Summacare and Medical Mutual and Humana. Trustees found it was a significant difference to go with Medical Mutual and Humana. The benefits keeping things the same in and out of network are identical. Your dollar will go further if you choose a network provider, but you don't have to. Employees also have the HSA Accounts and the issue that had transpired out of medical will now be covered under Medical Mutual.

Mr. Todd motioned to approve, for 2013, the health care provider for Medina Township to be Medical Mutual for major medical and Humana on special benefits for dental, vision and life. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Mr. Todd motioned to approve warrant #23590 to #23624 total amount of \$106,743.58. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Mr. Todd motioned to approve warrant #23625 to #23655 total amount \$29,817.36. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

Approval of Payroll

Mr. Todd motioned to approve payroll checks #16539 to #16557 total amount of \$24,554.55 with \$4,949.55 going to union dues, post-tax health, OPERS and Deferred Comp. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Mr. Todd motioned to approve payroll checks #16558 to #16617 total amount \$50,070.49 with \$6,531.35 going to union dues, post tax health, OPERS and Deferred Comp. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

Bank Reconciliation for October 2012

Mr. Todd motioned to approve the bank reconciliation for the month of October 2012, and incorporate by reference document dated December 1, 2012, 2:28 pm. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Approval of Minutes

Mr. Todd motioned to approve the minutes for the November 8, 2012, regular meeting. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

REPORTS

Fire Department

The Fire Department did not have a report for the month of November 2012.

Police Department

Chief Arbogast reported that for the month of November 2012, there were 955 calls for service (see attached). They assisted Westfield Bank with moving the safety deposit boxes. There was a threat to Wal-Mart for Black Friday that the department was able to defuse. Shop with a Cop is December 15.

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REPORTS CON'T

Service Department

Denny Miller, Road Foreman, read his report for the month of November 2012, (see attached). The war memorial flag pole was repaired and the flag replaced. Now, someone cut the ropes and stole the flag from the Park. A resident's son who is serving in Kuwait has offered to replace the flag with a flag that has flown over his son's camp in Kuwait.

Zoning Department

Elaine Ridgley, read the November 2012, Zoning Report and stated there were 22 permits issued for a total value of \$1,848,573.00 (see attached).

Mr. Todd motioned to approve the November Police, Service and Park and Zoning reports. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

OLD BUSINESS

Temporary Inflatable Sign Zoning Amendment

Mrs. Stogin said the temporary inflatable sign zoning amendment was a work in progress.

Frontier Contract and Intech Contract

Mr. Todd was told that Chad was working on the computers and no decisions were made on who was going to do the work. Mr. Todd said the contracts are being worked on.

RFP's for Comprehensive Plan

The Trustees discussed the comments received from several of the Steering Committee Members and they have been reviewing the 3 RFP proposals given to them comparing costs and hours they will provide. A decision will be made at the December 20, 2012, Trustees Meeting.

NEW BUSINESS

Baseball Fees

Mr. DeMichael spoke with Mr. Miller and Mr. Kessler about increasing the fees for use of the ball fields to \$40.00 (\$5.00 increase) per time slot. This would pay for us to have someone there on a part-time basis to line the fields and monitor the use of the fields. Mr. Todd said during the meeting with the other Townships and the City regarding collaboration, Montville said they get \$5,000.00 from Medina Youth Baseball (that averages out to \$35.00 per game). MYB fought paying us \$35.00 per field. Mr. Todd did get the Mayor to agree that some of the tax money collected from township residents pays the City for use of the fields. Mr. DeMichael said MYB scheduled 80 games and only used 50. Mr. Bischof said there is a lot of dead time on the Montville fields. That is the downside of exclusive use of the fields. Mr. DeMichael would like to inform those that use the fields that scheduling is opened. Mr. Jarrett asked if additional personnel would need to be hired and Mr. Miller told him no, we have the Ziegler young men that are already on the payroll.

Mr. Todd motioned to approve the fee of \$40.00 per time slot for 2013, for the use of Blakslee Fields. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

Medina Creative Housing Additional Space

Mr. Todd spoke with Mike Carlson and Mr. Carlson will speak to Dianne DiPasquale-Haggarty regarding the additional space. He also told Mr. Carlson that Medina Creative Housing would be under a similar pay structure as Medina Soccer Association. Mr. Jarrett said he looked over Chief Arbogast's agreement and said it was a good agreement. The Trustees will continue this at their December 20, 2012 meeting.

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NEW BUSINESS CON'T

RFP for Police Department

Mr. Todd asked Chief Arbogast to have the RFP for the Police Department reviewed by the Prosecutor's Office and then Trustees will make a decision at the December 20, 2012, meeting.

PURCHASE ORDERS AND TRAINING REQUESTS

OTA Conference – Alliss Strogin

Mr. DeMichael motioned to appropriate \$350.00 for Alliss Strogin to go to the OTA in Columbus January 30 and 31, 2013, for continuing education. Mr. Todd seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Todd and Mr. Jarrett.

Karvo Paving – Additional Work

Mr. DeMichael motioned for a purchase order requisition, vendor is Karvo Paving. We had additional work that needed taking the offset of the done and material for the 2012, paving project in the amount of \$12,880.47. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Mr. Todd asked if that was taking the offset of the difference of the 402, 60%. He also asked that a letter be sent to Karvo making it clear about this offset. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. Todd.

Wastewater Treatment Plant – Remsen Road

Mr. Miller and Chief Arbogast have received 4 quotes for servicing the wastewater treatment plant at the new building on Remsen Road. The Trustees will review the quotes and make a decision at their next meeting.

Vern Jividen Thank You Letter

Mr. Todd read the thank you letter received from resident Vern Jividen regarding the standoff on Remsen Road (see attached). Mr. Todd complimented the Township Police Officers for being well trained and able to handle that situation and other situations that arise.

ADDITIONAL DEPARTMENT HEAD COMMENTS

Police Dispatch

Chief Arbogast received a call from Medina City Chief Berarducci regarding the City Dispatch. It is the City's intent to continue with our dispatch contract. It will be going to City Council Monday.

Mr. Todd motioned to open the floor for public comment. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Robin Gray (4074 Remsen Road) discussed fracking and a JEDD in Medina Township.

Mr. Todd motioned to close the floor for public comment. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Mr. Todd motioned for Medina Township to conduct their 2013, Organizational Meeting on January 1st, 2013, at 10:00 am. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.




Direction for Fire Department Work Session

Weymouth Preservation Society Progress Report

Our goal to complete the restoration of the exterior, community room, restrooms and museum was met and the archives storage room is nearly done as well. The museum currently houses local history exhibits and a display of antique toys. Our open house was well attended and well received. Hundreds of historic items and photographs have been donated. We are now open the 2nd Sunday of every month from 2-4. Groups such as the Western Reserve Century Homes have been touring and we have received positive press.

We have raised & spent over \$8000 toward the restoration and displays cases. We have installed storage for the township's records and can receive them as soon as security cameras are installed. We should have 501c3 status by February. We have passed the first hurdles toward National Register status, which will enable us to apply for grants to double-glaze the steel windows and install period lights in the museum.

Our street signs will be installed as weather permits and we have 4 main activities and a new exhibit *Medina Township at War* planned for the coming year. Although a very small group did the bulk of the work, it was truly a community effort and we now have a fine new asset to the township. Thanks to the trustees we have a beautiful home. We are so pleased with the results and hope everyone will stop by to see us.


