RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING JUNE 19th, 2013

The Medina Township Board of Trustees met in regular session at the Medina Township Fire Station #1 on June 19th, 2013, to conduct the business of the Township. Chairman Todd called the meeting to order at 7:04 pm with the following Trustees in attendance: Michael D. Todd, Ray Jarrett and Ken DeMichael. Also in attendance were the Fiscal Officer, Police Chief, Fire Chief, Road Foreman and the general public.

Mr. Todd thanked everyone for accommodating him by changing the meeting to from June 20 to June 19. He also asked those that had comments to come to the front and speak into the microphone.

Roll Call

Mr. Todd asked for a roll call of all members present. Trustees present were Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Pledge

Mr. Todd led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Moment of Silence

Mr. Todd asked for a moment of silence for our military personnel at home and overseas.

Approval of Payroll

Mr. Todd motioned to approve payroll checks #17315 to #17366 in the amount of \$42,543.48 with \$5,508.76 going to union dues, OPERS and Deferred Comp. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Approval of May 2013 Bank Reconciliation

Mr. Todd motioned to approve the bank reconciliation for the month of May 2013, and incorporate by reference this two (2) page document dated June 2013. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

Approval of Accounts Payables

Mr. Todd motioned to approve warrant #24189 to #24249 in the amount of \$39,503.94. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

Approval of Minutes

Mr. Todd motioned to approve the regular meeting minutes for the June 6th, 2013. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

OLD BUSINESS

Temporary Inflatable Sign Zoning Amendment

Mrs. Strogin said the Zoning Board moved on all four (4) items regarding the temporary inflatable sign zoning amendment and the document will be sent to the Trustees for their July 5th, 2013, regular meeting.

Medina Soccer Association Draft Lease

Mr. Todd said he spoke with Ian Jones regarding the percentage and was told Ken is correct, the original discussion stated it would be 20% not 10%. Mr. Jones said they did not talk about renegotiating it annually just that it would be 20%. Mr. Jarrett asked if the agreement would be ready for the July 5th meeting. Chief Arbogast will take the changes to the Prosecutor.

Weymouth Cemetery Contract

Mr. Todd said in paragraph two (2) of the contract they want to include a provision explicitly denying and/or waiving the rights to indemnify. Mr. Todd said they cannot put in a provision denying or waiving our right to indemnify. Mr. Russell deleted paragraph nine (9) Arbitration on the advice of his attorney. Mr. Todd said that was acceptable and to contact Mr. Russell and explain about the paragraph regarding indemnification.

Fencing at Weymouth Cemetery

Mr. Miller showed the Trustees a sample of a wood grained vinyl fence and Mrs. McKiernan, President of the Weymouth Preservation Society, approved it. It will be a three (3) rail fence. The material can be purchased for \$1,308.00 and that is for 150 feet of fencing. Mr. Miller said the Service Department can put the fence up. The Trustees asked for a purchase order requisition.

NEW BUSINESS

Northeast Ohio Public Energy Council

Mr. Jarrett said the County Commissioners would like recommendations from the Townships as to whether the Natural Gas Aggregation should be on the ballot individually or countywide. The Trustees feel it should be countywide.

Mr. Todd motioned to request that the Medina County Commissioners seek the Natural Gas Aggregation on a countywide basis. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

Township Name Change Discussion

Mr. Todd thought about changing the name of Medina Township to Weymouth to give our community some distinction. It has to be put on the ballot. Mr. Jarrett would like some input from the public. Alliss Strogin said it will create problems. Sally Gardner said people don't know where they live, they think they live in Medina City and the name should be Weymouth. Mr. Jarrett thought a committee should be formed to look into a name change.

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NEW BUSINESS CON'T

Reserve Annual 4th of July Bike Parade

Mr. Todd motioned to allow for the Township to place barricades at Hardwood Hollow and Old Hickory and Hardwood Hollow and Hunting Run for the Reserve Homeowners Association to have a bike parade. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

PURCHASE ORDERS AND TRAINING REQUESTS

Gatchell Grant Resources, LLC

Mr. Jarrett motioned for a purchase order requisition for the Fire Department in the amount of \$3,000.00. This is for the AFG OPS Award Fee. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Jarrett, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Todd.

Discount Fence - Weymouth Cemetery Fencing

Mr. Todd motioned to appropriate \$1,500.00 for 150 feet of fence for Weymouth Cemetery payable to Discount Fence from Streetsboro, Ohio. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Walter & Haverfield Invoice Re: BZA Appeal

Mr. Todd received an e-mail from Mrs. Ridgley on June 7, 2013, saying Todd Hunt would be calling him. Mr. Todd has not heard from him as of this date. He is not happy with the service we have received as far as time limits and would like to terminate the contract, pay them this invoice and move on with someone else.

Mr. Todd motioned to approve the purchase order requisition in the amount of \$1,493.08 to Walter & Haverfield, LLP, regarding the 2012, BZA appeal. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Roll call vote: Mr. Todd aye, Mr. Jarrett aye and Mr. DeMichael no.

Mr. Todd said they will get with Mrs. Ridgley and come up with a new plan.

Mr. Todd motioned to terminate our agreement with Walter & Haverfield. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

REPORTS/ ADDITIONAL DEPARTMENT HEAD COMMENTS

Reports

Mr. Todd tabled the May reports until next month.

Mr. Todd motioned to approve the January, February, March and April Road & Bridge reports, the March and April Police reports, the March and April Fire reports and the March and April Zoning reports. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Police Department

Chief Arbogast said the concrete has been laid at Creative Housing at Remsen Road.

Road Department

Mr. Miller said he had to shut down the north section of Huffman Road because two (2) twenty-four inch pipes (24") pipes separated eight (8) feet underground and he repaired it.

Weymouth Preservation Society Report/Name Change Support Letter

Mrs. Gardner said the Trustees should have received a proposal and petition regarding the name change of S. Weymouth Road to Old Weymouth Road. She explained that the Post Office will continue to deliver mail to either name. Mr. Todd reviewed the petition and said 76.6% agreed to the name change. Trustees were asked to give a letter of support to the Medina County Commissioners.

Mr. Todd motioned for the Township to send a letter of support for the renaming of South Weymouth Road to Old Weymouth Road and incorporate by reference at least a copy of the petition and all the documents that were provided to us by Ms. Gardner and the Weymouth Preservation Society. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Mrs. Gardner said thank you for the fencing and that Mr. Russell suggested not taking the shrubs to protect the stones from road salt. On June 30 they will have a booth at the antique show on the square.

Road Department Employee Compensation

Mr. Todd said there is pay disparity in some of the Road Department's personnel. They told Mr. Miller he had a 3% budget increase for payroll however you delineate that amongst his employees is up to him.

Denny Miller: from \$23.02 to \$23.71 which is a 3% increase of \$0.69.

Ed Kerr: from \$22.80 to \$23.26 which is a 2% increase of \$0.46.

Jeff Kessler: from \$18.54 to \$19.46 which is a 5% increase of \$0.93.

Mr. Todd said they are not doing retroactive pay but Mr. Miller can give employees a bonus for good work done during the course of last year, it is permitted under the ORC. The bonuses are based off the amount of pay increase would be over that period of that time. The total of all increases for 2013 is \$4,325.40 and for 2012, it is \$4,530.00 which is 3% of total of all salaries in 2012 (see attached).

Mr. Todd motioned to approve the proposed pay rate increases for 2013 and make them effective June 22, 2013. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Mr. Todd motioned to open the floor for public comment. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Sandra Bilek (3414 Hamlin Road) asked if the Zoning Inspector was able to refuse to sign the zoning permit for the Sunoco Compressor Station. Mr. Todd said she could not refuse to sign it. Mrs. Bilek asked if the Trustees were aware the permit was signed and if there should have been a public hearing. Mr. Todd said the zoning code approves it and to make any modifications to the zoning code would have to be done legally.

Alliss Strogin, Zoning Chairwoman, said utilities are exempt from zoning and the Zoning Inspector doesn't even have the right to look at it.

Charles Huber, Medina County Building Department, said his office administers, for Medina Township, and the Township is under the Ohio Building Code and the Ohio Mechanical Code which are found at Ohio Administrative Code at 4101:1 and 4101:2.

Mr. Jarrett said he appreciates Mrs. Bilek informing them of the situation but there is very little the Township can do.

Jim Bilek (3414 Hamlin Road) asked if our Fire Department personnel are the responders and will they know how to respond to what is going through the facility. Chief Crumley said the pipeline companies are very good at notifying them and training with them. Mr. Bilek thanked Mr. Jarrett for attending the session regarding the Natural Gas Aggregation held by the Medina County Commissioners.

Joanne Slorgie (129 S. Broadway St., Lodi) showed the official application for the Sunoco Compressor Station from the Building Department, H2 for the compressor and F1 for the electrical control building. She asked how they can go from H2 which is high hazard use to F1. Mr. Huber explained that he questioned the plans and Sunoco has submitted new drawings which he is reviewing.

Mr. Todd said if it is approved as a F1 and the compressor station comes in and it is really an H2 how is it enforced. Chief Crumley said when they do an inspection and find it is in violation then a violation would be issued and they have to go back to the Building Department for a change of occupancy.

Sandra Bilek brought up the fertilizer plant explosion in Texas and that is what has raised her concerns. She feels the building has to have the proper classification.

Alliss Strogin said Emergency Management has the entire log of all emergency hazard sites in the County. The responders can call in to the EMA and they will be told what is there.

PUBLIC COMMENT CON'T

Robin Gray (4074 Remsen Road) has questioned about the expansion of the facility.

Mr. Todd motioned to close the floor for public comment. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Tax Budget

Mrs. DeHoff, Fiscal Officer, gave all the department heads the appropriation status reports to use when preparing their budgets. The tax budget will be worked on at the July 5, 2013, Trustees meeting. Mr. Jarrett asked how we are doing financially and Mrs. DeHoff said we are doing well because we are staying under budget.

Part-time Police Officer Wages

Mr. Todd said Chief Arbogast recommended the starting rate for part-time Police Officers be \$14.50 per hour and after 1 year of service the rate would be \$16.16 per hour. There would be bonuses for education that other Police employees receive. The rates would be \$1.00 per hour for an Associate's Degree, \$1.50 per hour for a BS/BA Degree and \$2.00 per hour for a Masters Degree and above. Part-time Officer Jeffrey Linkser, who has been a Judge, Magistrate and Prosecutor and has a Masters Degree, will receive \$18.16 per hour.

Mr. Todd motioned to approve the adjustment in pay effective June 23 for Jeffrey Linsker from \$14.50 per hour to \$18.16 per hour pursuant to the pay schedule and pay scale incorporated in this e-mail dated June 11, 2013, from Chief Arbogast to myself. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Then and Now Purchase Order - Lakota Concrete

Mr. Todd said Trustees approved a \$7,000.00 contract for concrete in the Remsen Road building for the Medina Creative Housing area. Trustees would recoup the \$7.000.00 per the Memorandum of Understanding with Medina Creative Housing, over a period of time. The job was to be finished by June 20 because volunteers were coming in on June 21 to do work for Medina Creative Housing. CeeJay Concrete was unable to perform the job in a timely fashion. The second lowest quote was contacted and they agreed to do the job for the lower price of \$7,000.00, and finish in the allotted time. The vendor name has changed so the purchase order has to be changed. He spoke with Linda DeHoff, David Arbogast and Bill Thorne to see if this was allowed and he asked the Fiscal Officer to speak with the Auditor to see if it was an appropriate mechanism to do this. The Auditor said it was allowable as long as you explain why it was done.

Mr. Todd motioned to approve a \$7,000.00 payment to Lakota Concrete for the work done at the Remsen Road Building for the site improvements of Medina Creative Housing area and state that there was an unaccounted for reason why this had to be done without a purchase order and that a then and now purchase order is necessary due to the previous contractors inability to complete the contract in a timely fashion so we had to use a substitute contractor. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

OTA Grant Workshop-Where to Find Grants

The Trustees discussed sending a few employees to the OTA Grant Workshop on June 24. Mrs. DeHoff and Mr. DeMichael will be able to attend the September 17 workshop.

Mr. Todd motioned to approve the expenditure of \$130.00 payable to the Ohio Township Association for a grant writing workshop for June 24 for Chief David Arbogast and Laurie Shoemaker to attend. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Executive Session for Employee Compensation

Mr. Todd motioned to go into Executive session with the Fire Chief, Mark Crumley, Fiscal Officer, Linda DeHoff and the Board of Trustees to discuss employee compensation. The Board entered into Executive Session at 9:03 pm. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

Mr. Todd motioned for the Medina Township Board of Trustees to reconvene from Executive Session where the Board of Trustees were present with the Fiscal Officer and the Fire Chief to discuss employee compensation. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett. The Board reconvened at 9:43 pm. No decisions were made during that meeting.

EMPLOYEE PAY RATES

Fire Department Pay Rates

Mr. Todd motioned to approve the 2013, suggested base pay rates, which we'll call pay rates, and make them effective June 23 for the Fire Department and incorporate by reference this one (1) page document with the pay rates for each position for the Fire Department. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Administrative and Zoning Pay Rates

Mr. Todd motioned to pay the Township Secretary \$16.25 per hour effective June 23, 2013. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

Mr. Todd motioned to pay the Administrative Assistant to the Trustees \$15.25 per hour effective June 23. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Mr. Todd motioned to approve the pay of \$16.77 an hour to the Zoning Inspector effective June 23. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Fire Chief and Fire Clerk Pay Rate

Mr. Todd motioned to approve the pay change for the part-time Fire Chief to \$29.16 per hour effective June 23. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

Mr. Todd motioned to approve pay of \$15.25 per hour for the Fire Department Records Clerk. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

Back Pay

Mr. Todd said Trustees are not going to have back pay this year; instead they are going to look at some kind of bonus structure with the Township Secretary, Administrative Assistant and the Zoning Inspector. We are going to conduct our six (6) month review to see how everything is going and they will base their recommendations on the review.

OTHER BUSINESS

Flag Day Expenses

Mr. Todd motioned to approve the payment of \$98.29 to Laurie Shoemaker for Flag Day expenses. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

Flag Day Winner

Mr. Jarrett said we have a flag design winner and asked if any quotes were received for the cost to make the flags. Mrs. Shoemaker said she has received one (1) quote from Staples and she is waiting for the other two (2) quotes. Mr. Jarrett said to be sure there is a warranty and that the flags are made in America.

Commendations

Mrs. Shoemaker said she has not received the commendations from Secretary of State Husted's office as of this date. She will contact his office again. She asked Mr. Batchelder if he can provide a commendation for Rob Erickson for his winning flag design. Mr. Batchelder said yes.

Old Salt Shed

Denny Miller, Road Foreman, asked for permission to get quotes to have the entire old salt shed taken down. The Trustees said to get some prices.

Mr. Todd motioned to adjourn the meeting at 9:55 pm. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

The History of South Weymouth Road And the Reasons for a Proposed Name Change

South Weymouth Road has carried many names over its history. It has been Weymouth Road, Main Street, part of the CCC highway and State Route 3. It became South Weymouth Road when Interstate 71 was completed and Weymouth Road was extended to it instead of curving into the village of Weymouth.

The existing road name is confusing: since both portions of South Weymouth Road curve, only part of it is south of Weymouth road. The majority of it is actually *east* of Weymouth Road. People assume there is a north Weymouth. We would like to change it to a less directional and more descriptive name.

"Old Weymouth Road" is appropriate; it was indeed Weymouth Road in the past, and the name is fitting for a village settled in 1817.
