Mr. Todd asked for a roll call of all members present. Trustees present were Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

## VFW Post 5137 Award Presentation

The Trustees presented Scott Kopfstein and Ron Kesek of VFW Post #5137 with an award for their continued participation and support of Medina Township's Flag Day Ceremony. Mr. Kopfstein thanked the Trustees for the award and also thanked the Police and Fire Departments for their help in the VFW's Wounded Warrior Event, the Fire Department for putting the large Flag up and the Police Department for directing traffic.

# Commendation from John Husted, Ohio Secretary of State

The Township Trustees received a commendation for their 5<sup>th</sup> Flag Day Celebration from Ohio Secretary of State, John Husted, on behalf of the people of the State of Ohio in gratitude for their exemplary work in bringing an event to the community that commemorates the flag.

## Karen Thompson-Repas – Rental of Part of Remsen Building

Mr. Todd asked Karen Thompson-Repas to tell Trustees what exactly she wants to do. Mrs. Thompson-Repas said she is a for-profit company and an occupational therapist. ## Tax Budget 2014

Mr. Todd said there was one issue with the Road & Bridge budget. When the numbers were put in, it came back over budget by \$18,000.00. Mr. Todd told Mrs. DeHoff to take it out of site improvements. It can be taken out of the general fund next year. Mr. Todd explained that the change in millage would be General fund from 1.60 to 1.30 and Road & Bridge from 1.00 to 1.30.

## Resolution No. 07182013-016

Mr. Todd put forth a resolution to approve the tax budget for 2014, and incorporate by reference the eighteen (18) page Financial Worksheet Budget dated July 12, 2013, 2:21 pm and also the one page letter to Mary Beth Guenther of the Auditor's Office requesting the change to our inside millage. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

# Falcon Ridge Cluster Development Flooding

Mr. Todd and the Trustees received a letter and pictures regarding flooding in the Falcon Ridge Cluster Development off of Granger Road. The water comes within 10 feet of the back deck of the homes. Mr. Todd spoke with County Commissioner Adam Friedrick and Dan Willhoite of the County Engineer's Office to set up a meeting to discuss comprehensive planning for storm water in the county and Medina Township specifically. A meeting date has not been set yet.

## Revisit Sign at Remsen and Huffman Roads

Mr. Todd discussed the issue of the one-way stop at Huffman and Remsen Roads. There have been near accidents with cars turning left from Huffman onto Remsen. He said the County Engineer suggested making it a two-way stop at the T and a stop sign was put up as a test. Mr. DeMichael wasn't on the Board at that time so Mr. Todd would like to revisit the sign issue again. Previously it was discussed and Mr. Jarrett and Mrs. Gardner had concerns that it would be confusing having it a two-way stop instead of a three-way stop. Mr. Todd said if there was a three-way stop it would make it difficult for the salt trucks and other vehicles to stop on the hill in inclement weather. Mr. Miller will get the information regarding making this a two-way stop and present it to the Trustees at their next meeting

# Replacement of Flat Roofs on Remsen Building

Mr. Miller said to tear off the bad section and put it back on would cost \$53,291.00. To patch the roof it would cost approximately \$10,000.00. The question is, do they want to re-roof it or patch it. Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael are uncomfortable with the price and want to research it some more. Mr. Todd tabled this so Mr. Miller, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael can look into the cost.

# Verbal Judo Class - Officer Nicholson

Mr. Todd motioned to appropriate \$395.00 for Cliff Nicholson to attend the Verbal Judo Class in Columbus from August 20 to August 21 for professional development. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

Mr. Todd motioned to appropriate \$1,520.00 for Chief David Arbogast to attend the International Association of Chiefs Convention in Philadelphia from October 19 to October 23. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

# Frank Gates BWC Group Retro Rating Program

Mr. Todd motioned to appropriate \$3,850.00 to Frank Gates for our BWC Group Rate from July 1, 2013 to June 30, 2014. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

# Police Report

Chief Arbogast said TV 5 news did a piece on the gentleman who had a heart attack while golfing at Bunker Hill Golf Course and the fact that response by our Police, Fire and LST saved his life. Chief Arbogast purchased safety awards for all the personnel involved and would like to do a presentation at the next Trustees meeting. He is also again going to ask Medina Hospital to donate portable AED's. Mr. Jarrett said this gentleman was resuscitated 5 times and a month later he was back on the golf course.

# Fire Department

Lieutenant Draiss also said because of the response from all the departments and the cooperation between the Police, Fire and LST this call had a happy ending.

# Road Department

Road Foreman Miller asked the Trustees for permission to have pickup at the townhall instead of hauling all the bags back to the road department. The bags break open and get nasty. The cost would be \$33.91 per month for two (2) large cans. The Trustees gave their approval.

# Zoning Department

Mr. Todd said there were 24 permits issued for June 2013, in the amount of \$887,396.00.

Weymouth Road name change. A school bell was donated and she asked if anyone had a way to help them put it in the cupola. She asked about putting signs on Remsen Road advertising Weymouth Days.

Mr. Todd asked Chief Arbogast if there was any problem with allowing Medina Sunoco to renew their Liquor License. Chief Arbogast said there were no problems. The Trustees do not request a hearing.

Mr. Todd motioned to give Road Foreman Denny Miller permission to scrap worn out street signs that were owned by the Township and no longer have value to the Township. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Mr. Todd motioned to open the floor for public comment. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Dianna Huffman (4025 Remsen Road) asked what verbal judo was. Mr. Todd said it is Police training on how to handle confrontations verbally.

Robin Gray (4074 Remsen Road) gave Trustees a new map for the Nexus Pipeline. She said it runs parallel with the Sunoco Pipeline which carries ethane. Mr. Jarrett said Sandra Bilek will get a packet of information together to give to the Prosecutor to determine if it is a public utility.

Joanne Slorgie (129 S. Broadway Lodi) said the first fracking well is in Harrisville Township and was concerned because the Fire Department didn't have any idea what chemicals are involved or what is going into fracking well

Andrew Root (4172 Fawn Run) said he didn't realize how much behind the scenes work is done at the Township.

Mr. Todd motioned to close the floor for public comment. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.
