

**RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS
MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
NOVEMBER 30th, 2017
7:00 PM**

The Medina Township Board of Trustees met in regular session at the Medina Township Hall on November 30th, 2017, to conduct the business of the Township. Chairman Ostmann called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm with the following Trustees in attendance: Bill Ostmann, Ray Jarrett and Ken DeMichael. Also in attendance were Fiscal Officer Ventura, Fire Chief Painter, Police Chief Arbogast, Road Superintendent Miller, Law Director Thorne and the general public.

Roll Call

Mr. Ostmann asked for a roll call of all members present. Trustees present were Mr. Ostmann, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Pledge

Mr. Ostmann led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Moment of Silence

Mr. Ostmann asked for a moment of silence for our service members both here and abroad and for our first responders who risk their lives every day to keep us safe.

SITE PLANS

Dental Works – 5014 Grande Shops Avenue – Sign

Mr. Ostmann motioned to accept the recommendation of the Zoning Commission and approve a tenant panel to be placed on the existing south pylon sign for Dental Works located at 5014 Grande Shops Avenue not to exceed 22.09 square feet as presented. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Ostmann, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

The Station – 3280 Old Weymouth Road - Sign

Mr. Ostmann motioned to accept the recommendation of the Zoning Commission and approve a directional sign for the “Station” located at 3280 Old Weymouth Road not to exceed 4 square feet as presented. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Ostmann, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

OTHER BUSINESS

Supplemental Appropriations

Mr. Ostmann motioned to move \$1,000.00 from account number 1000-120-323-0000 to account number 1000-110-211-0000 and to move \$800.00 from account number 1000-120-323-000 to account 1000-130-211-0000 and move \$8,000.00 from account number 2031-760-730-0000 to account number 2031-330-211-0000 and incorporate this document by reference. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Mr. DeMichael asked what this was for and Mrs. Ventura said this was to cover OPERS payments for the departments for the rest of 2017. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Ostmann, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

Approval of Accounts Payable

Mr. Ostmann motioned to approve accounts payable check #28718 through #28759, total amount \$32,234.78. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Ostmann, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Mr. Ostmann motioned to approve accounts payable checks #28760 through #28797, total amount \$60,610.84. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Mr. DeMichael said he didn’t get the itemized thing from Mr. Thorne. Roll call vote: Mr. Ostmann aye, Mr. DeMichael no and Mr. Jarrett aye.

Mr. Ostmann motioned to approve warrant #28709 the amount is \$3,000.00 this is September attorney fees for William L. Thorne. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Roll call vote: Mr. Ostmann aye, Mr. Jarrett aye and Mr. DeMichael no.

Approval of Payroll

Mr. Ostmann motioned to approve payroll checks #23648 through #23666. Total amount, \$30,700.18 with \$5,864.79 withheld for union dues, taxes, OPERS, etc. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Ostmann, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

Mr. Ostmann motioned to approve payroll checks#23667 through #23687. Total amount \$32,472.20 with \$5,909.13 withheld for taxes, union dues OPERS, Etc. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Ostmann, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Approval of October Bank Reconciliation

Mr. Ostmann motioned to approve the October bank reconciliation. It is a three (3) page document and I will incorporate it by reference. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Ostmann, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

Mr. Ostmann motioned to approve the minutes for the October 19 regular meeting and the October 23 special meeting. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Ostmann, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

Mr. Ostmann motioned to approve the minutes for the November 2 regular meeting, the November 10 emergency meeting and the November 20 special meeting. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Roll call vote: Mr. Ostmann aye, Mr. DeMichael aye and Mr. Jarrett abstain.

Mr. Ostmann motioned to approve the October department reports as presented. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Ostmann, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

DEPARTMENT HEAD COMMENTS

Fire Department

Chief Painter said they hired three (3) more Firefighters yesterday and Monday the Huffman Road station will be online and we will have 6 guys permanently assigned there.

Office for Older Adults

Mrs. Gardner said the Office for Older Adults will have a Christmas Party on December 15 at 11:30 am and the cost for the meal is \$4.00. There will be a New Year's Eve Party on December 29 at 11:30 am and the meal cost is \$4.00. There will be special activities every day from December 18 through the 22.

Brian Feron read the report from the Weymouth Preservation Society (see attached).

NEW BUSINESS

Approval of Recycling Old UAN Hard Drives by Intech

Mr. Ostmann motioned to approve Intech to recycle the two (2) old UAN hard drives dated 8/2013 and 2004. They are no longer of any value to the Township. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Ostmann, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

NEW BUSINESS CON'T

Authorization for Fiscal Officer to Prepare Accounts Payable Checks for December 14th, 2017, Regular Meeting

Mr. Ostmann motioned to authorize the Fiscal Officer to prepare accounts payable checks for the regular meeting dated December 14th, 2017 due to the Trustees attending the Township Association Christmas Party. There will be no meeting for that date. Trustees will then approve the checks by vote at the December 28th regular Trustees meeting. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Mr. DeMichael asked if they could make the meeting the 21st instead of the 28th. Mr. Ostmann modified his motion to state Trustees will then approve the checks by vote at the December 21st regular Trustees Meeting. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Mr. DeMichael asked if we were changing the meeting from the 14th to the 21st and Mr. Ostmann said correct. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Ostmann, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

Authorization for Fiscal Officer to Prepare Payroll Checks for December 14th, 2017, Regular Meeting

Mr. Ostmann motioned to authorize the Fiscal Officer to prepare payroll for the pay dated December 15th, 2017, and to allow those funds to be direct deposited as usual to Township employees. Trustees will not have a regular meeting on December 14th, 2017; however, the Trustees will approve the payroll at the next regularly scheduled meeting which is December 21st, 2017. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Ostmann, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett.

Resolution for Sale of Materials to Township/Villages from Medina County Engineer
Resolution No. 11302017-025

Mr. Ostmann motioned to put forth a Resolution and this Resolution number is 11302017-025 stating that the Parties hereto intend to enter into this agreement, pursuant to the authority granted in Ohio Revised Code 307.15.

The Board of Medina Township Trustees agrees to purchase and the Board of County Commissioners of Medina County agrees to sell such materials as from time to time may be required for the construction, maintenance, or repair of any township road or building.

The price of the aforementioned materials to the Township shall be the purchase price and any expenses incurred in such purchase by the Board of Commissioners.

The Board of Commissioners hereby authorizes the Medina County Engineer to handle the purchase and sale of such materials to the Township as specified above.

This agreement shall become effective on the first day of January, 2018, following the signing by both parties, and will expire on the 31st day of December, 2018.

Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Ostmann, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael. Mr. Jarrett asked if this is the same agreement that we entered into last year and Mr. Ostmann said yes it is the same agreement entered into every year.

Fire Department Copier

Mr. Thorne said he was able to finally work through the companies involved with the Fire Department copier. They did release the Township from the two (2) year one (1) month contract that was almost \$3,000.00. They also agreed that you did not have to return the copier if you are willing to pay its value of \$271.00. Mr. Thorne said it was going to cost \$591.00 to ship the copier back so it is cheaper to purchase the copier for \$271.00 then ship it back for \$591.00. Mr. Ostmann motioned to authorize Fiscal Officer Ventura to pay the \$271.00 to Wells Fargo Financial Leasing and we are buying the equipment. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Ostmann, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. De Michael. Mr. Miller asked if the Service Department could have the copier because he was going to ask for permission to buy one next year. The Trustees approved and the Fiscal Officer will transfer the \$271.00 from the Service Department to the Fire Department.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Mr. Ostmann motioned to open the floor for public comment. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Ostmann, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael.

Karen Fisher (3495 Old Weymouth Road) said on behalf of the Medina County Board of Health and Medina County Emergency Management. The Board of Health has received a grant and is working on processes for emergency preparedness for our functional needs population. You can sign up with Medina County Emergency Management to pick and choose how you want to receive emergency alerts. Chief Painter said this is a new system with the county so Police and Fire and the community itself can use it for emergency alerts.

Robin Gray (4074 Remsen Road) asked what the RING check was. Mrs. Ventura said this is grant funded. Chief Arbogast said it is another phase of the lock box program. They are developing the qualifications and one of the criteria's is you must have a cell phone. She also asked what the Montville check was for and Mr. Ostmann said that is for a shared detective.

Sally Gardner (3333 Foskett Road) said the Office for Older Adults is compiling a list of all communities that do snow plowing, lock boxes and that type of thing and they will make it available.



Voting aye thereon: Mr. Ostmann, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Jarrett. The Board entered into Executive Session at 7:37 pm. The Board reconvened at 7:45 pm. No decisions were made in executive Session.


Mr. Ostmann motioned to adjourn. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Ostmann, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. DeMichael. There being no further business to come before the Board the meeting was adjourned at 7:46pm.

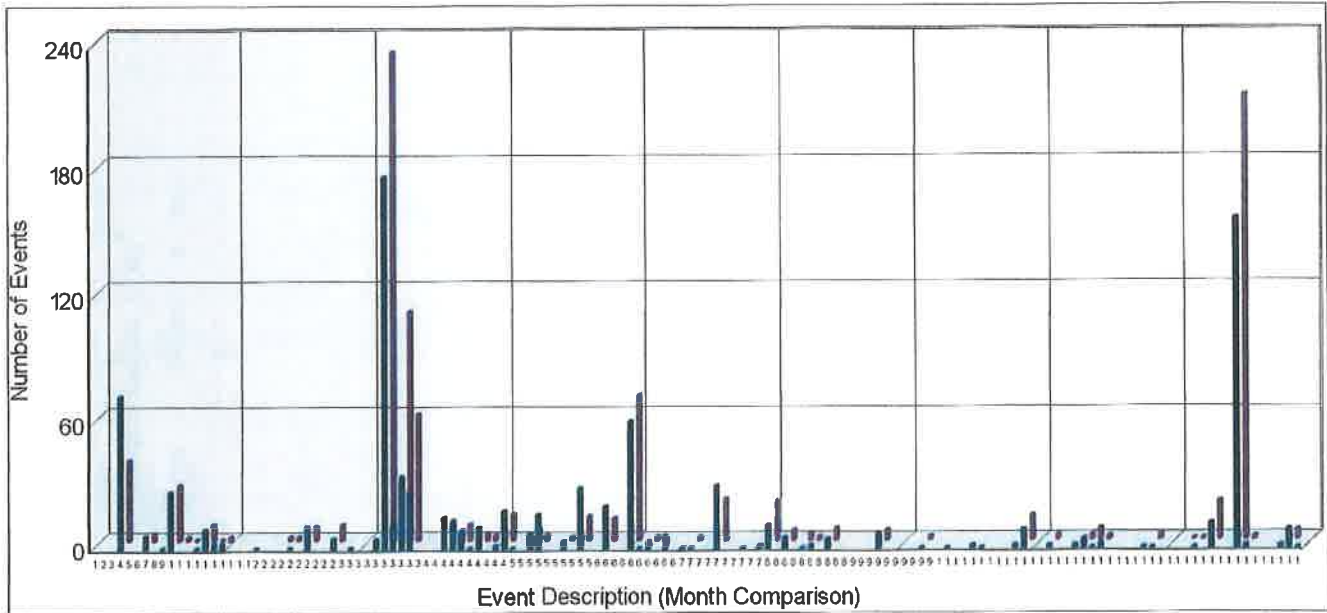

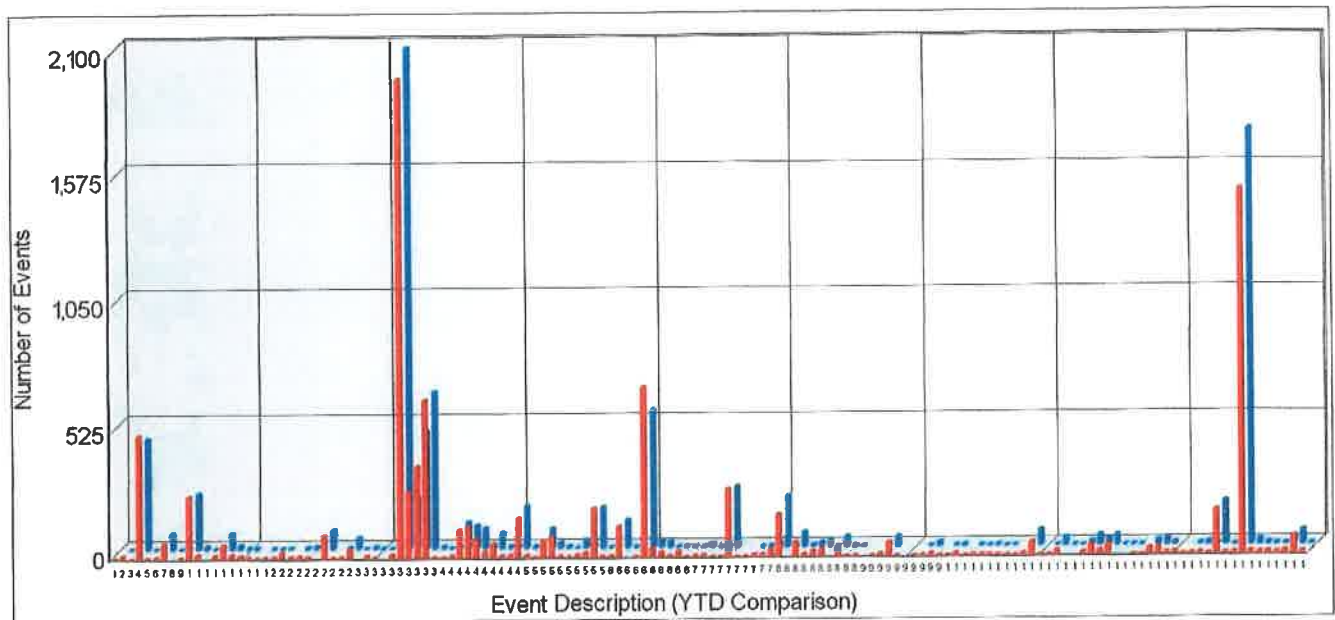
