

**RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS
MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
NOVEMBER 1ST, 2018
7:00 PM**

The Medina Township Board of Trustees met in regular session at the Medina Township Townhall on November 1st, 2018, to conduct the business of the Township. Chairman DeMichael called the meeting to order at 7:04 pm with the following Trustees in attendance: Ken DeMichael, Mike Stopa and Mark Radice. Also in attendance were Fiscal Officer Ventura, Road Superintendent Miller, Zoning Inspector Ridgley, Police Chief Arbogast, Fire Chief Painter and the general public.

Roll Call

Mr. DeMichael asked for a roll call of all members present. Trustees present were Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Stopa and Mr. Radice.

Pledge

Mr. DeMichael led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Moment of Silence

Mr. DeMichael asked for a moment of silence for our military both home and abroad as well as our first responders.

SITE PLANS

Ohio Cabinets & Counter Tops – 3812 Pearl Road – Site

Mr. DeMichael motioned to accept the recommendation of the Zoning Commission and approve the use for Ohio Cabinets & Counter Tops to be located at 3812 Pearl Road as presented. Mr. Stopa seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Stopa and Mr. Radice.

Ohio Cabinets & Counter Tops – 3812 Pearl Road –Wall Sign

Mr. DeMichael motioned to accept the recommendation of the Zoning Commission and approve a wall sign for Ohio Cabinets & Counter Tops located at 3812 Pearl Road not to exceed 18.00 square feet as presented. Mr. Stopa seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Stopa and Mr. Radice

Dr. Nguyen – 3613 Reserve Commons Drive – Site

Mr. DeMichael motioned to accept the recommendation of the Zoning Commission and approve the change of use for Dr. Nguyen to be located at 3613 Reserve Commons Drive as presented. Mr. Radice seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Radice and Mr. Stopa.

Wendy's – 3067 Medina Road – Wall Sign (A)

Mr. DeMichael motioned to accept the recommendation of the Zoning Commission and deny the request for an additional sign on the south elevation of the building for Wendy's located at 3067 Medina Road as it does not meet Section 605 I.1of the Medina Township Zoning Resolution as presented. Mr. Stopa seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Stopa and Mr. Radice.

Zoning Process Change

Mr. DeMichael asked Mr. Stopa the status of the zoning process change. Mr. Stopa received the informal review yesterday but he has a couple of questions to ask Mr. Henwood. The second phase has started and now he needs to review it all. Mr. Stopa said they will then have to discuss it as a Board, send it back to the Department of Planning as a formal which should make the process easier there, we then hold public hearings and go from there.

OTHER BUSINESS

Mark Herwick – Homestead Insurance Agency

Mr. Herwick asked if the Trustees could vote tonight on whether or not to accept the renewal from Medical Mutual. The medical increase for 2019 was 1.7%, 0 on dental, 0 on vision and 0 on life; effectively your cost going into 2019 won't change at all. Mr. Herwick amended the original September 28 version and was able to rewrite the policy for Mrs. Goe and save the Township \$200.00 per month; everything will remain the same for her. Mrs. Ventura asked Mr. Herwick to explain the group over 50/Cobra. Mr. Herwick said a wage and tax statement was sent to Medical Mutual when this group was established. At that time we had numerous volunteer Firefighters that were on the rolls and Medical Mutual classified this group as a large employer over 50 because of full-time equivalents and that is the way you are still registered today. Mr. Herwick mistakenly sent a former employee something that stated he could COBRA the benefits for twelve (12) months and that was in error, he actually has eighteen (18) months as long as he continues to pay his premiums. This is effective until June 30, 2019. Mr. DeMichael asked if that's how it will be going forward or because we are not fifty (50) any longer. Mr. Herwick said they could ask Medical Mutual to reclassify us as a small employer group and in that case we would be subject to State continuation which the maximum period would be twelve (12) months. Mrs. Ventura asked if it affects our rates and Mr. Herwick said no, it doesn't change anything. Mr. Herwick said he has to honor what was there. Mr. DeMichael asked if it would behoove us to do that then and Mr. Herwick said it would. Mr. Herwick said going forward, to not set a future precedent, then it's twelve (12) months from here on out. Mrs. Ventura asked if that would change anything with our Grandfather/Grandmother status. Mr. Herwick said no. Mr. DeMichael asked when the employees could make changes. Mr. Herwick said open enrollment starts from December 1st through December 30th. Mr. DeMichael asked if they can add or subtract dental insurance and that kind of thing in the month of December. Mr. Herwick said they will have notices for all employees instructing them on what to do. Mrs. Ventura asked if there will be an issue with the opt-out payments because of the over 50 under 50 employees and Mr. Herwick said no because none of what the employees contribute would ever exceed 9.5% of their income if the 84/85 15%..... Mrs. Ventura said if the employees are opting out and if they are paying for other insurance that could still come back on us because we offer the insurance. Mrs. Ventura said the bargaining unit states you can take the opt-out but it doesn't specify that it's only if you are going to be on a spouses or parents (if your under 26) plan so technically somebody could take the opt-out and go buy a plan on exchange and we don't want that. Mrs. Ventura would like to change the language.

Mr. DeMichael motioned to accept this plan as presented. Mr. Radice seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Radice and Mr. Stopa.

Supplemental Appropriations

Mr. DeMichael motioned to approve the reallocation of supplemental appropriations dated October 30, 2018, to cover expenses for the balance of 2018 and incorporate this one page document by reference. Mr. Radice seconded the motion. Mr. DeMichael asked what the \$55,000.00 and \$25,000.00 were for. Mrs. Ventura said the \$25,000.00 was for the insurance payment we received for FS#2 from Medina City insurance. She had enough money appropriated and created a line item from the general fund and moved money from the improvement of site line, Remsen, because we have quite a bit of money left on that so we didn't have to increase the certificate and she also created a revenue fund and deposited the check into that specific account and then we can pay from that. The \$55,000.00 was for the radios for the Fire Department. She moved the money from the Safety Services Levy to that line item but we are not moving forward at this time. Mr. Radice said it is the same as the Police, we have no choice. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Radice and Mr. Stopa.

Then and Nows

Mr. DeMichael asked why there were resolution numbers on these then and nows and Mrs. Ventura said anything over \$3,000.00 has to have a resolution number. Mr. DeMichael motioned to accept a then and now purchase order for North Gateway Tire total amount \$391.49 for four (4) car tires. Mr. Radice seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Radice and Mr. Stopa.

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Then and Nows Con't

Resolution #11012018-019

Mr. DeMichael further moved to approve Resolution #11012018-019 and approve a purchase order a then and now purchase order for Simmons Brothers Construction total amount \$4,300.86. This is for the emergency demo/clean up/temp enclosure of Fire Station 2 like I said total amount is \$4,300.86. Mr. Stopa seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Stopa and Mr. Radice.

Resolution #11012018-020

Mr. DeMichael moved to approve Resolution #11012018-020 and attach with it the then and now purchase order for City of Medina Finance Dept. This is for emergency reimbursement for light tower repair to Will Burt Company. Total amount is \$5,907.59. Mr. Stopa seconded the motion. Mr. DeMichael said this is for repairs to Fire Station 2 as well. Mr. Radice said no this was for the rescue truck. Chief Painter said this was for the light tower that was damaged. They just won't give you the parts, they refurbished the whole thing and we couldn't leave it out of service so we paid for it while waiting for the insurance to reimburse us. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Stopa and Mr. Radice.

PURCHASE ORDERS AND TRAINING REQUESTS

Wayne Garage Doors Sales – FS#2 Door Repair

Mr. Stopa motioned to approve a purchase order for Wayne Garage Doors Sales out of Dover, Ohio. The total is going to be \$1,678.31. This is for repair to garage door at Fire Station #2. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Stopa, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Radice.

Rocco Masonry and Concrete – FS #2

Mr. Stopa motioned to approve a purchase order for Rocco Masonry and Concrete out of Wadsworth, Ohio. Total amount is \$5,950.00 and this is for the masonry repair at Fire Station #2. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Stopa, Mr. DeMichael, and Mr. Radice.

Blanket Certificate for Repairs of Fire Station #2

Mr. Stopa motioned to approve a regular blanket certificate in the amount of \$7,554.74. This is earmarked for finishing and miscellaneous repairs to Fire Station #2. Mr. Radice seconded the motion. Mr. Stopa said this is the additional stuff that the insurance company doesn't know what is left to repair. Once the masonry and garage door is up there still might be some finishing stuff inside so this covers hopefully the repairs that will be done. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Stopa, Mr. Radice and Mr. DeMichael.

Recess Called

Mr. DeMichael called for a recess for a couple of minutes so he could make a phone call. The meeting resumed at 7:37 pm.

Zuercher – Police Department CAD Reporting System

Mr. Radice motioned to accept a purchase order. The vendor is Zuercher and the total; it's for the Police Department for \$4,958.10. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Mr. Radice said it is for the RMS software that they need to use as part of the CAD reporting system. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Radice, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Stopa.

Montville Township – Shared Detective

Mr. Radice said he has one more here and it's for Montville Township. Total is \$6,610.02 and it's for our shared detective for 2018. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Chief Arbogast said this was covered by the grant but the grant expired. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Radice, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Stopa.

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PURCHASE ORDERS AND REQUISITION CON'T

Schaeffer's Specialized Lubricants -Service Department

Mr. DeMichael motioned to accept a purchase order requisition for our Service Department. The vendor is Schaeffer's Specialized Lubricants. \$1,711.71 is the total. This is for the 2018/2019 plow season to service all large dump trucks. Mr. Stopa seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Stopa and Mr. Radice.

Henderson Products – Service Department – Henderson Snow Plow

Mr. DeMichael motioned to accept a purchase order requisition for our Service Department. The vendor is Henderson Products, Inc. This is for a Henderson snow plow. Total amount is \$9,385.00. Mr. Stopa seconded the motion. Mr. Stopa asked if this was replacing another plow and Mr. Miller said yes. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Stopa and Mr. Radice.

Medina Auto Mall – Service Department

Mr. DeMichael motioned to accept a purchase order requisition for our Service Department. Vendor is Medina Auto Mall. This is for a 2018 GMC Sierra 3500 utility truck to replace a 2004 Ford F250 utility, \$39,142.50 is the total. Mr. Radice seconded the motion. Mr. Radice asked how many miles were on the 2004 Ford. Mr. Miller said about 90,000 and it has the six (6) liter diesel and everybody is telling us at 100,000 it will be in bad shape. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Radice and Mr. Stopa.

Blanket for Service Department – 2018 GMC Sierra

Mr. DeMichael motioned to accept a purchase order requisition for our Service Department, it's a blanket certificate for emergency lights, labor and plow mount for the 2018 GMC Sierra that we just talked about. \$10,500 is the total. Mr. Stopa seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Stopa and Mr. Radice.

Greater Cleveland Partnership – COSE Membership Dues

Mr. DeMichael motioned to accept a purchase order requisition for our Admin Department. The vendor is Greater Cleveland Partnership. It's for COSE membership dues. \$460.00 is the total. Mr. Stopa seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Stopa and Mr. Radice.

OTHER BUSINESS

Approval of September 2018 Bank Reconciliation

Mr. DeMichael motioned to accept the September bank reconciliation as presented it is a three (3) page document. Mr. Radice seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Radice and Mr. Stopa.

Approval of Accounts Payable

Mr. DeMichael motioned to accept accounts payable checks #29552 to #29593 total amount \$36,917.72. Mr. Stopa seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Stopa and Mr. Radice.

Mr. DeMichael motioned to accept accounts payable checks #29594 to #29622 total amount \$51,829.07. Mr. Radice seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Radice and Mr. Stopa.

Approval of Payroll

Mr. DeMichael motioned to accept payroll check #24250 through check #24270 total amount \$30,665.46 with \$5,892.02 being deferred. Mr. Radice seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Radice and Mr. Stopa.

Mr. DeMichael motioned to accept payroll check #24272 through check #24299 total amount \$38,762.35 with \$6,987.87 being deferred. Mr. Radice seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Radice and Mr. Stopa.

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Approval of Department Reports

Mr. Stopa motioned to approve the department report for the Road and Bridge for August and this was from last time, as presented. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Stopa, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Radice.

Mr. Stopa motioned to approve the department reports as presented, Fire, Police, Zoning and Road and Bridge and this would be the September 2018 reports. Mr. DeMichael seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Stopa, Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Radice.

Approval of Minutes

Mr. DeMichael motioned to accept the meeting minutes regularly scheduled meeting on September 6, 2018 and the special meeting September 10. Mr. Radice said he didn't attend the September 10 special meeting. Mr. DeMichael said just the September 6 regular meeting. Mr. Stopa seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Stopa and Mr. Radice.

Mr. DeMichael motioned to accept the September 10 special meeting minutes as presented. Mr. Stopa seconded the motion. Mr. Radice was at the September 10 meeting. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Stopa and Mr. Radice.

Resignation of Ed Kerr From Service Department

Mr. DeMichael read the letter of resignation from Ed Kerr of the Service Department due to OPERS health care coverage. Mr. DeMichael thanked him for his many years of service. Mr. DeMichael motioned to accept Ed Kerr's resignation. Mr. Radice seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Radice and Mr. Stopa. (This is effective 10-18-18)

DEPARTMENT HEAD COMMENTS

Service Department

Mr. Miller asked for permission to put the 2004 Ford F250 on Gov.Deals with a minimum bid starting at \$5,000.00. Mr. DeMichael motioned to add that 2004 Ford F250 truck Gov.Deals with a minimum of \$5,000.00. Mr. Stopa seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Stopa and Mr. Radice.

Mr. Miller received a call from the paving company and they are hoping to start on Huffman Road for the repairs they are going to do on Saturday.

OLD BUSINESS

Discussion of Hood Road

Mr. DeMichael said they are still waiting to hear from the County Engineer. Mr. Miller said we put in for the OPWC grant but we did not receive it.

Fire District Update

Mr. Radice said they met with the State Representatives from the Auditor's Office and we're moving forward with that project for the feasibility study. We are meeting at the end of the month to start setting up the scope of work and get the information together so they can do their study. Mr. Radice said we are moving along and it is heading in the right direction and we are not paying a dime for the study. Mr. DeMichael asked how long they think the study is going to take and Mr. Radice and Chief Painter said by May of next year and we will have updates along the way.

Police Contract

Mr. DeMichael asked the status of the Police Contract. Mr. Radice said we'll probably have something to present to the Board at the next meeting and then we will meet back with them. Mr. DeMichael asked if the Prosecutor's Office was representing and Mr. Radice said yes.

EMA All Hazards Meeting

Mr. Radice said All Hazards from the Emergency Management Agency will be holding meetings on Wednesday November 28 2:00 to 4:00 pm or Thursday November 29 from 6:00 to 8:00 pm. They want a representative from the Township to attend. It could be the Road Department Supervisor or a Trustee. Mr. Radice asked if Denny, Mike or Ken could attend the meeting on Wednesday because he will be at the Fire District meeting and Thursday's meeting is a Trustee meeting so none of us can make that meeting. Mr. DeMichael and Mr. Miller will attend the meeting on the 28th.

Annual SPCA Donation

Mrs. Ventura said we received our annual letter from the SPCA asking for a donation to offset the costs of the animals that are rescued in the Township. Mr. DeMichael motioned to approve to donate in one way shape or form to the SPCA, Medina County. Mr. Radice seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Radice and Mr. Stopa.

Walkthrough of Pearl Road Upgrades

Mr. Stopa received an e-mail from Police Secretary Sue Galaska from Scott Turcek of ODOT asking for someone to do a final walkthrough on the Medina Township section of Pearl Road to be sure it is completed. Mr. Miller said he has already done that. Mr. Turcek asked Denny to make a list and get it to him. Mr. Miller said there are a few minor issues. Mr. Radice asked Mr. Miller to inform Mr. Turcek of the issue with the turn arrow at Stonegate and Pearl. Chief Arbogast has spoken to Mr. Turcek about the issue already.

Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Radice and Mr. Stopa. The Board entered into Executive Session at 8:14 pm. The Board reconvened from Executive Session at 10:40 pm where they were discussing considering the employment of a public employee.

Also, between Christmas and New Year's we have a scheduled meeting on December 27. Mr. DeMichael motioned to eliminate the meetings that we had scheduled on December 13 and the 27 but rather have meetings on December 10 and 20 and have those meetings start at 7:00 pm. Those will be regularly scheduled meetings for Medina Township Trustees. Mr. Stopa seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Stopa and Mr. Radice.

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OTHER BUSINESS CON'T

Composition of Ad for Administrative Assistant

Mr. DeMichael motioned to allow Mike Stopa to compose an ad for an administrative assistant position that we are going to consider to hire. Mr. Radice seconded the motion. Mr. DeMichael said the idea is to get this out get this advertised as soon as possible. Advertise it where it makes sense, Ohio.com, Cleveland.com. he asked Mr. Stopa if he is going to look into those and Mr. Stopa said yes. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Radice and Mr. Stopa.


Mr. DeMichael motioned to adjourn the meeting Mr. Radice seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. DeMichael, Mr. Radice and Mr. Stopa. There being no further business to come before the Board the meeting was adjourned at 10:44 pm.

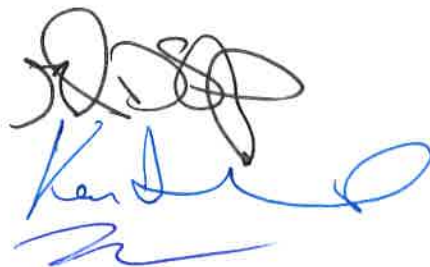
